

## Determining Compliance

**Example 1:** A local educational agency (LEA) operates Title I, Part A programs at 15 of its 18 campuses. It has an LEA parent involvement policy that it updated at the beginning of the school year, based on recommendations from a committee that included teachers and parents. Each of its Title I, Part A campuses was also directed to revise its campus parent policy. Fourteen Title I, Part A campuses did so. How should the LEA answer Program Implementation Question #7 for Title I, Part A? (See “Guide to Answering Program Implementation Questions for 2012-2013,” page 3).

**Example 2:** An LEA operates a Title I, Part C program for its migrant students. It has its migrant-specific activities listed in its District Improvement Plan, and the activities listed match the ones approved in the Consolidated Application for Federal Funding. How should the LEA answer Program Implementation Question #3 for Title I, Part C? (See “Guide to Answering Program Implementation Questions for 2012-2013,” page 11.)

**Example 3:** An LEA is a single attendance area: it has a K-5 campus, a 6-8 campus, and a 9-12 campus. All of its teachers meet the highly qualified teacher requirements. How should the LEA answer Program Implementation Question #4 for Title II, Part A? (See “Guide to Answering Program Implementation Questions for 2012-2013, page 21.)

**Example 4:** An LEA split-funds its Title III personnel. The job descriptions for these staff members list Title III, Part A duties, as well as state-required responsibilities. How should the LEA answer Program Implementation Question #7 for Title III, Part A? (See Guide to Answering Program Implementation Questions for 2012-2013, page 25.)
